The illustrations in this set were created by Lakota Milera-Weetra. Lakota is a proud Arabana woman and artist who is actively engaged in reviving the Arabana language.

Each card is double-sided, featuring the Arabana word on one side and the illustration and English translation on the other.

The language on these cards belongs to the Arabana People. We acknowledge and pay our respects to Arabana Elders past, present and emerging.

These cards have been produced by the South Australian Museum in partnership with the Mobile Language Team, and Lakota Milera-Weetra. 











